Eurodoc to Take an Active Role in the European Commission Open Research Publishing Platform -Open Research Europe



On 20 March 2020, the European Commission announced that it had awarded <u>F1000 Research</u> the opportunity to launch an ambitious <u>Open Access Publishing Platform</u> for Horizon 2020 and Horizon Europe, in which Eurodoc

Eurodoc Took Part in the 69th Bologna Follow-Up Group Meeting (BFUG)



Our new representatives from the <u>Young Scientists Council</u> of Ukraine (RMU), Iryna Hubeladze and Anastasiia Simakhova, attended the <u>69th BFUG Meeting</u> held in Kyiv on 4-5 February 2020 on behalf of Eurodoc. New RMU

Chairman Olesia Vashchuk also joined the meeting and supported us in the promotion of our proposals. Eurodoc and RMU representatives took part in the discussion about the future of the EHEA and raised issues important for ECRs, such as clear mentioning of doctoral candidates and doctoral training, as well as Open Science and transferable skills. Following the meeting, Eurodoc sent a proposal for the Rome <u>Communique</u>, that outlines decisions taken by the Ministers after such conferences.
