Eurodoc and CERN Openlab To Support Early Career Researchers' Cloud Access



Eurodoc and CERN openlab will support Early Career Researchers (ECRs) in Europe working on COVID19 with small grants in the form of vouchers to access cloud services for storage of research data, analysis and

computation. The aim of these small grants is to support ECRs carrying out research on the coronavirus and related topics with free access to cloud services, such as storage and computing, provided by European service providers. The budget of the call amounts to €10 000 and will be distributed to 10 research projects. The application ends 8 May 2020. More information can be found here.

The Eurodoc Doctoral Training Working Group is running a survey on '<u>Doctorates across Europe</u>'. You can now compare doctoral training systems across 13 European countries with the requirements of the European Training

Network (ETN). There are two models: the <u>Innovative Training</u> <u>Network (ITN)</u> and the <u>European Joint Doctorates (EJD)</u> funded by the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) under the Horizon 2020 programme, which are considered to be the European model of doctoral training.

DORA Statement on Hiring, Promotion and Funding Decisions During the COVID-19 Pandemic




